Bullying Statistics

- Nearly 1 in 3 students (27.8%) report being bullied during the school year
- Students who experience bullying are at increased risk for:
 - Depression
 - Anxiety
 - Sleep difficulties
 - Substance use
 - Academic difficulties
 - Violence in adolescence and adulthood
 - Physical symptoms (headaches, stomachaches, etc.)



Bullying and Queer Youth

- 81.9% of students who identify as LGBTQ were bullied in the last year based on their sexual orientation
- 31.8% of LGBTQ students missed at least one entire day of school in the past month because they felt unsafe
- The average secondary school student hears an anti-gay slur 26 times a day.
- One in four teens who come out face family rejection. Family rejection significantly increases risk of depression, suicide, and risky behavior.
- **30-40**% of the nation's homeless youth are Queer teenagers.
- Queer youth are **2-6x** more likely to attempt suicide.

The Broader System

- Schools operate as part of an ecological system (family, media, friends, neighborhoods)
- Null Environment

- Systemic approaches
 - Displaying affirming posters ("safe space")
 - School-wide initiatives (Day of Silence)
 - Highlighting/advertising GSA presence

The Classroom Environment

- Creating safe and affirming classroom space
 - Addressing derogatory language
 - Using open/neutral language
 - Setting expectations from DAY ONE
 - Lesson plans on bullying, gender, and family
- Religious beliefs conflict
 - Legal responsibility in role
 - NC General Statute 155C-407
 - NEA Code of Ethics & AAE Code of Ethics
 - makes a constructive/reasonable effort to protect the student from conditions detrimental/harmful to learning, health, or safety.

Individual Incidents

- If witness, **STOP** the behavior immediately
- **EDUCATE**: Use as a teachable moment

- Attend to specific target of behavior
 - Validation
 - Connection to resources
